Why now?

There's a housing crisis in America. More than half a million people in the United States are homeless – a quarter of whom are children – and over half of all American adults (52%) have had to make at least one sacrifice in order to pay their rent or mortgage.

Major U.S. cities such as San Francisco, Los Angeles, Boston, Washington, D.C. and New York are experiencing extreme homelessness and affordable housing issues that are driving populations out of metro areas and negatively affecting the ecosystem of cities and communities.

Years after the recession hit, many people are still fighting to stay above water -- they are having to start again after foreclosure or are unable to afford a home of their own, as is the case with the millennial generation.

Federal, state and local funding is stagnant or diminishing. There is simply not enough public sector funding to confront and solve the current housing issues.

We need to redefine Home. We need to change the way people think about where they live. Home is not just about the four walls around us, it's about the environment that affects the choices we make in life and who we become. With a new understanding of Home and its benefits, we can improve the stability of housing across the nation.
